DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#116 E. Second Street is a three story, flat roofed, running bond brick house which faces North on E. Second Street. It is a residential detached building.

The principal facade is three bays in width. The main entrance occupies the first bay in the N/W corner. The door has four panels with four glass panels at top; there is a plain cornice separating door from stained glass transom. Above the transom is a marble lintel. Windows occupying the second and third bay are double hung, single pane with white marble sills and lintels. Windows in the second and third story are double hung, 2/2 sash with white marble sills and lintels. There is a boxed cornice with small brackets. Below the cornice, five bricks down, there is a wooden moulded belt course. Four rows below that is a protruding brick frieze. There is an open porch with wood floor, denticulated cornice and four Doric pillars; a simple wrought iron railing goes around porch with three brick steps with hand rail leading to the porch. The wooden porch is supported by small brick pillars.

East end exposure is six bays wide. The windows on the first story are double hung, single sash with white marble sills and lintels. Windows on the second and third story are double hung, 2/2 sash with marble sills and lintels. There is a single flush chimney. Between the fifth and sixth bay are five exposed small cellar windows with white marble sills and lintels; an extended second bay wing, all windows are small, double hung, 6/6 sash with marble sills and lintels. In the first bay there are wooden steps leading to an entrance which is located in the first bay of the South end. A small porch is hooded and supported by three small columns and wooden hand rail. There's a small yard in front and back.
