DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#117 E. Second Street is a Victorian clapboard, 2-1/2 story hip slate roofed house which faces South on the Esat corner of Chapel Alley and Second Street. It is a residential, detached building.

The principal facade is four bays wide which includes a three window tower in the first and fourth bay which goes around each edge of the house. The main entrance is in the third bay. It is a large, double, beveled glass door with transom. Windows are double hung, single pane with wooden frames and sills. There is a large open wooden porch running the length of the building with wooden railing and pillars. Over the main entrance, the porch roof jets out and is capped by a decorative pediment. Immediately above the pediment there is a palladian window. The West tower has a small pyramidal slate roof, gable dormer in the center with two decorative windows, and the East tower roof comes to a sharp point with decorative ornament on top. There are two corbelled chimneys in the center of the roof with a captain's walk between the chimneys. There are four cement steps with wooden rail leading to the front porch.

The East exposed side is three bays wide and also includes part of the East tower. There is an entrance in the center bay with a small wooden porch, railing and pillars. All windows have wooden sills and frames; all are double hung, single sash.

This house is built on a brick foundation with exposed cellar windows.

On the hip roof there is one small gabled dormer and one large one.

It has a front and side yard with retaining wall. The back yard is enclosed with wooden fence. It has a garage and was built about 1906.
