DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a temple-like, 2-1/2 story house of brick, detached and rectangular-shaped with no wings. It is three bays wide and approximately five bays long with rear galleries. The building sets back from the building line at the end of the front sections of its neighbors. First floor fenestration occupies two double bays with a paneled door and large side windows on the left and double windows on the right side, both with 1/1 sash and wide segmental brick arches having infills decorated by a carved roundel and pointed end panels. The second story has a wide central unit of double glass over panel doors with a transom and wide 1/1 sash windows on either side, all topped by a wide segmental brick arch with the same infill decor as on the first floor. The wide front pediment contains another triple unit of Paladian shape with a round arched window in the center and lower wood lintel topped windows on either side, all of 1/1 sash. The sidewall areas contain some interesting leaded stained glass windows of several forms, such as a pair of wood casements on the right side, a unit of two sets of casements and a regular sized window topped by a wood panel decorated with a roundel on the left side. Also on the left side is a brick pediment with two narrow windows--all quite unusual for a moderate sized house. The right side of the roofline is lighted by two peaked dormer windows with 6+6 wood casement windows. Other windows are of 1/1 sash with louvered shutters and two row header brick segmental arches. The steep slope "A" frame roof is ornamented on the front with a pediment edged with a moulded cornice with returns and by moulded cornices on the sides. A double flue chimney rises from the center of the ridge and another along the sidewall. All brickwork is of common bond. The first floor facade is protected by a deep covered porch with Doric columns and pilasters with a moulded cornice and approached by four wooden steps. This building rests on a high foundation.
