## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a tall, three story brick house detached on the left side and approximately three bays square with 1/2 of a 2-1/2 story "T" shaped wing which is five bays long and 1-1/2 bays wide with a side balcony and a newer, one story extension. All brickwork is of common bond and the front displays recently restored salmon colored brick. The front entrance occupies the left bay with double doors of glass over panels and an elliptically arched transom with a moulded transom bar and a three row header brick arch. This is approached by a three step granite porch. To the right of this is a very wide, triple, half-round arched window with moulded mullions and a half round brick arch. Above the door is a 1/1 sash bay window with panels and grooved and dentil trim. Other front windows are also of 1/1 sash with those on the second story having flat brick arches of shaped voussoirs and those on the third floor being shorter and with regular brick arches. Rear area windows are of 2/2 sash with wood lintels and sills and louvered shutters. There are doors with glass over panels and two pane overlights. The front section roofline slopes to the rear and the wing has a steep slope "A" frame, both of metal. The front roofline has a rather simple Victorian cornice with incised diagonal slits, a band of moulding and of small, half round dentils with the bays divided by grooved brackets. The house rests on a low fieldstone foundation. To the rear is a tall tree and gardens.
