DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a large brick, detached pair of three story houses, six bays wide and three bays in depth with a "T" shaped wing, five bays long and three bays wide of brick and three stories in height . This has side balconies and various extensions. All brickwork is of common bond. Front entranceways of the Tehan style* occupy the first and fourth bays from the left with marble sills and #225 retains a four pane overlight. All front windows of #225 are of 6/6 sash with flat brick shaped voussoirs, arches and louvered shutters, except a newer bay window over the door with 1/1 sash with panel and dentil trim. #227 has 1/1 sash on the first floor and 6/6 sash on the upper stories, all with flat brick-shaped voussoir arches and all windows become smaller as they rise. Rear windows on #225 are also of 6/6 sash and 9/6 sash with wood lintels and sills and louvered shutters. Also, there are four panel doors with two pane overlights. #227 has all 6/6 sash windows with wood lintels and sills and there are four panel doors. The front roof slopes to the rear with parapet sidewalls and the wing has a low slope "A" frame. The front roofline is decorated by a typical Tehan* cornice. The building sets on a low foundation.



STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

*This pair of houses are part of a row of large similar Victorian buildings built by local builder John Tehan, who constructed the nearby St. John's Catholic Church. They all display his trademark decor such as six panel doors, paneled enframements, pilasters with moulded "returns" at the top and bottom headed by moulded flat entablatures and with boxed roof cornices with closely spaced, scrolled brackets.
