**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a 2-1/2 story, detached brick pair of houses, four bays wide and three bays in depth with no balconies or wings except for #315 which has a newer one bay square, two story "L" shaped extension with composition siding. All brickwork is in common bond and of a light salmon color. Front doorways occupy the second bay from the left on each house with three pane overlights and #313 retains an old four panel door. This house also retains the old 6/6 sash windows (hand blown glass) in old thin frames, front and rear, while #315 has them only on the second floor rear. All have wood lintels and sills with louvered shutters on the front. There is also an old kitchen door on #315 with top panels now in glass. The roof is of metal with a moderate slope "A" frame resting on two string brick cornices and with wide enclosed chimneys rising from each gable. These houses rest on a low fieldstone foundation and #313 is fronted by a brick pavement.
