DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a large brick detached pair of three story houses, six bays wide and three bays in depth with a "T" shaped brick wing being five bays long and three bays wide with side balconies. This has been altered with first and upper story frame extensions. All brickwork is of common bond. Front entranceways occupy the first and fourth bays from the left with newer doors, Tehan* doorway and with #233 retaining the original four pane overlight. Both have marble sills and three or four step concrete porches. All front windows are of 1/1 sash except #233 with 6/6 on the third story with flat brick arches which become smaller as they rise. #233 has marble sills on the first floor and 6/6 sash with wood sills and lintels on the wing area and with glass over panel doors. #235 has an old 2/2 sash JIB window-door and 2/2 sash on other rear windows with wood lintels and sills. It also has four panel doors with overlights. The front roof slopes to the rear with parapet sidewalls and the wing area has a low "A" frame roof. The front roofline has a "Tehan"* cornice. This building rests on a high fieldstone foundation.



STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

*These houses are part of a row of large, similar Victorian houses built by local builder, John Tehan, who constructed the nearby St. John's Catholic Church. They all display his trademark decor such as six panel doors, paneled enframements, pilasters with moulded "returns" at the bottom and top headed by moulded flat entablatures and with boxed roof cornices with closely spaced scrolled brackets.
