DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#9 is a 2-1/2 story brick house detached on the right (E) side. It is approximately three bays square with a 2-1/2 story brick "L" shaped wing, six bays long and two bays wide with a long side balcony and a two story brick, one bay square extension and small brick dependency. The front facade has been refaced with a red pressed brick and all is in common bond. The main entranceway occupies the left bay and is of three part Federal design with a six panel door, sidelights of leaded glass of intersecting ovals, separated by Doric columns, an intricately moulded, paneled enframingent, white marble sill, a three part overlight of similar design to the sidelights and a moulded transom bar. This is approached by a brick porch with wrought iron railings. All front and side windows are of 1/1 sash with louvered shutters and flat brick arches with shaped voussoirs on the front. On the rear of the first floor front section is a 6/6 JIB window-door. Wing windows are 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills and louvered shutters. There are simple, three part doorways with sidelights and overlights in the first bay of the wing on the first and second stories. There is also a four paneled door with a three paned overlight. The attics are well lighted by two pedimented, segmental, arched 9/6 sash dormer windows on the front and two 6/6 sash shed roof dormers on the rear of the front section. There are also two 6/6 pedimented dormer windows on the wing. The front section has a rather steep "A" frame roof with sidewalls rising to form roof curtains with end buttresses. Pairs of double enclosed chimneys joined by curtains rise from each gable. The wing has a shed roof with an end curtain and buttress, and there is a wide chimney on the end. Both roofs are covered by asphalt shingles. The front roofline is adorned by a moulded cornice. This house rests on a rather low fieldstone foundation and there are boxwood gardens to the rear.
