DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a three story set of three houses detached on the left side. The building is nine bays wide and approximately four deep with two story brick wings, three bays long and two bays wide with end balconies. The wing of #1 is "L" shaped, while #3 & 5 share a "T" shaped wing. All brickwork is in common bond and the front facade is decorated by three string belt courses with the centers of alternately raised, vertical headers tying in all fenestrations just below the arches. This same decor is used across the street at #8-12. Front entranceways occupy the first, fourth, and seventh bays from the left with pairs of Victorian style doors of three panels, half round transoms with paneled transom bars, white marble sills, and all approached by newer, four to five step brick porches. All front windows are of 1/1 sash. Those on the first floor are large, round arched with upper story windows being segmental arched except the third story of #3 which has round arched windows. These arches are of long shaped voussoirs on the first floor and with three row headers on the upper stories with #3 having hood moulds on the third story. The infills of the segmental arched windows are centered by carved roundels with incised scrollwork. Rear windows are of 2/2 sash with mostly two row header, segmental arches. There are pairs of mullioned, 1/1 sash windows on the rear of the third stories. On the rear are four panel doors with two pane transoms. The front section roof slopes to the rear with the wing roofs being rather flat. The front roofline Victorian cornice is decorated with bands of scallops, dentils, incised foliage and quarter round dentils. Long brackets fronted by paired pillars (as on #8-12) and half spheres divide the bays on the frieze and in between are incised panels. This is ended by a band of dentils. The building rests on a rather high fieldstone foundation and fronted by a herringbone patterned pavement. There are very short rear yards.
