DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a brick detached, three story row of three homes with a total width of nine bays and approximately five bays in depth with two story brick wings, three bays long and two bays wide with rear balconies. An unusual feature is that these balconies are trimmed with moulded cornices and dentils. The wing of #8 is of an "L" shape and #10 & 12 share a "T" shaped wing, and all end in three sided brick bays. All brickwork is of common bond with the front facade having three string belt courses with the center row of vertical headers alternately raised and tying the fenestration together just below the arches as on #1, 3, & 5 across the street. Slightly recessed front entranceways occupy the first, sixth & ninth bays from the left with pairs of Victorian style glass over panel doors with white marble sills, old ornate cast iron porches and elliptically arched transoms. All front windows are of 1/1 sash with two row header segmental brick arches. On the rear of the third story are pairs of mullioned 1/1 sash and other rear windows are of 2/2 sash with flat brick arches. The roof of the front section slopes to the rear and the wing roofs are rather flat. The Victorian style roof cornice is ornamented by bands of various sized dentils supported by long brackets fronted by pairs of small pillars as on #1, 3, & 5 across the street, and these divide the bays. In between are indications of former panels with incised cross motifs. This building has a rather high fieldstone foundation with a front basement entrance half below grade. There are very short yards to the rear with #10 being landscaped.
