DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a brick 2-1/2 story pair of houses detached on the right side, four bays wide and two bays in depth with two story brick "U" shaped wings 1-1/2 bays wide and three bays long with a side balcony on #21 and a rear balcony on #19. All brick-work is in common bond. Entranceways occupy the left bay of each house with an original door on #21 with the top panels round arched and a newer six panel door on #19. Both have segmental arched transoms with a new leaded, stained glass insert at #19. First floor windows also vary with #19 having a wide 1/1 sash segmental brick arched opening with the infill decorated with a roundel and panels, while #21 has a double window with a segmental brick arch decorated by an infill with roundels and incised scrolls and with a moulded mullion. All second story front windows are of 2/2 sash with brick segmental arches and louvered shutters, segmentally arched. Cellar windows also have segmental brick arches. Rear area windows are of 2/2 or 6/6 sash with either wood lintels and sills or flat brick arches and louvered or paneled shutters. The roof of the front section has a steep "A" frame with a double flue chimney rising from the right side of each house. Wings have shed roofs and all are of metal. The front roof cornice line consists of a raised brick frieze with a band of brick header dentils. This building rests on a rather low fieldstone foundation. #19 retains a brick herringbone pattern pavement. Both have long yards to the rear.
