## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Originally, this was a two story house. It was double, semi-detached, non-related, and rectangular plan with rear wing. The facade is three story brick of common bond and three bays. There are three third floor windows, all 6/6 with shutters and wooden slipsills. There are three second floor windows, 1/1 with segmental arches, radiating voussoirs of brick, and arched shutters. They also have wooden slipsills. The first floor has two windows on the east side, 1/1 segmental arches, radiating voussoirs, and these are taller than the second floor windows. They have arched shutters, wooden slipsills, and window boxes with flowers. There is an old gas lamp with convex beveled glass near the door. The front door is off center on the west side with segmental arch structural opening, radiating voussoirs, plain moulding, and also with embrasure, recessed transom light, and main panel door. A louvered door is added to the outside. There are straight steps leading to the ground with iron railing.

The rear wing is two stories and probably earlier than the rest of the house because the brick is different and there is evidence of a former side entrance. It is four bays wide with 6/6 windows on the balcony, four windows on the first floor, three windows and bricked-in door on the second floor.

The building has a full basement with stone foundation, and there is evidence of an old fireplace. It has a flat metal roof. There are two brick chimneys, both inside, one single center west, one single rear west (SW) and one inside on the east side which was closed when the roof was raised to create a third story.

This building is on the south side of E. Third Street.
