DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick pair of houses attached to others in a row. It is five bays wide and approximately three bays in depth with a newer two story block full width extension rising from the rear level to the height of the second story front section because of the grade. All brickwork is of common bond. Front entrances with newer doors and narrow overlights occupy the second and fourth bays from the left (S) side. The center bay contains a board and batten gate guarding steps leading down 8' to an enclosed passageway to the rear yard levels. All front windows are now of 1/1 sash with wood sills, moulded top lintels, and louvered shutters. Rear windows are of 6/6 sash and there are four panel doors. The attic of #335 is well lighted by a small 1/1 sash peaked dormer window on the front and rear while #337 has a 6/4 sash peaked dormer window on the front. The building has a moderate slope metal "A" frame roof resting on three string brick cornices and wide enclosed chimneys rise from each gable. The high fieldstone foundation rises from the rear level to the front pavement level.
