DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a three story, semi-detached brick structure related to the house to the west. The plan consists of a front wing and a narrower rear wing. There are three original stories in the front wing and two in the rear wing with a gallery extending from the second floor rear wall. An additional third story of wood frame as well as a third story gallery have been added to the house. There is a full cellar and the foundation walls are fieldstone. There are three chimneys -- two in the front wing and one inside the rear wall.

The facade brickwork is finer than the brickwork on the other walls. Running bond is seen on all walls. Brick is used on the facade from the ground to the brick (decorative band of vertical brick above basement fenestration). There are original, four panel, double doors recessed at the entrance. A recessed transom with decorative crosspiece is above the doors. The architrave is plain with embrasure. There is one large, two sash, double hung window and transom with decorative transom bar on the first floor facade. A three-window bay extends from the second floor. The windows are double hung with two sashes; there is one other double hung, two sash window on the second floor. Two double hung, two sash windows are on the third floor. There is a narrow, decorative stationary window above these windows. The bay window roof trim is boxed cornice with dentils. The bay roof is tin.

Other facade windows have a pink sandstone lintel and a brick lugsill of brick header bond. Facade windows are one over one and the louvered shutters have been removed. Windows on walls other than the facade have a segmental arch of double courses of brick header bond and a wooden slipsill, louvered shutters. They are double hung, two sash windows of one over one or two over two lights. Windows on the third floor rear frame addition are plain wooden, double hung, two sash windows of two over two lights. The house roof is mansard decorated with slate shingles and fronted with a large center brick gable common to the front facade wall. There is a boxed cornice on the gable and plain frieze. A decorative finial extends from a small urn. There is a boxed cornice with decorated frieze at the lower border of the slate shingles on each side of the central gable. The roof itself is flat aside from this facade decoration.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

This is a three story brick pair of houses detached on the right side. It is four large bays wide, approximately five bays in depth with two story brick "U" shaped wings, three bays deep and two narrow bays wide with rear balconies and galleries. #30 has a frame, third story added to the wing. Rear windows are of 2/2 sash with two row brick header segmental arches. There are four panel doors with transoms. The roof slopes to the rear with stepped sidewalls and the wing roofs are rather flat.

Small sections of moulded cornice trimmed with dentils cross the building at the bases of the third story pediments (gables). This building sets on a high foundation with front cellar entranceways 1/2 above ground.
