DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#33 is a three story brick house detached on the right, three bays wide and approximately four bays in depth with a two story brick "L" shaped wing three bays long and two bays wide with a three story, one bay square side extension and a new, two story brick rear extension. All brickwork is of common bond with the front recently restored displaying a soft salmon colored brick. The front entranceway occupies the left bay with double doors of panels, brownstone sill, a five pane overlight with a moulded transom bar, a paneled soffit, and side enframement, and the whole contained by Doric pilasters supporting a moulded flat entablature trimmed by dentils. An antique gas lamp and wrought iron porch railings enhance the entrance. All front windows are of 6/6 sash with wood sills and lintels with top moulding and raised end blocks. Front windows become shorter as they rise. Rear area windows are also 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills and there are doors with four panels with three pane overlights. The front section roof slopes to the rear with stepped end walls, and the wing roofs are rather flat. The front roofline is adorned by an overhanging cornice supported by paired, plain, scrolled brackets dividing the bays and large dentils on a raised brick frieze. The cornice continues around the corners. This big house rests on a low fieldstone foundation. There is a brick pavement.
