## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#36 is a two story brick house detached on the left, three bays square, with an "L" shaped, two story brick added wing five bays long and 1-1/2 bays wide with a side balcony. All brickwork is of common bond. The front entranceway occupies the right bay with a six paneled door, paneled soffit and enframing, narrow transom, and is approached by a three step brick porch with iron railings. All windows have 1/1 sash with flat brick arches of shaped voussoirs on the front and wood lintels and sills on the rear. The front section roof slopes toward the rear and the wing has a shed roof with both of metal. The front roof cornice is rather simple with small, closely spaced, cut and moulded brackets on a wooden frieze. The house rests on a rather low fieldstone foundation. It is enhanced by a brick front pavement, brick side patio, and a small landscaped dooryard garden.
