## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick detached pair of Federal houses, four bays wide and approximately three bays deep with a 2-1/2 story brick "T" shaped wing, three bays wide and two bays in depth with side balconies and a 1-1/2 story frame summer kitchen extension which is two bays square and shared by both houses. All brickwork is in painted common bond. Front entranceways occupy the outer bays with newer doors, paneled enframements and narrow overlights. These are approached by newer three step brick porches. All front windows are 2/2 sash with wood lintels with top moulding and raised end blocks similar to #33 and with louvered shutters. Rear area windows are of 6/6 sash with regular wood lintels and sills. There are four panel doors with narrow overlights. The attics are lighted from the side and rear gables by two six pane windows in each. Both the front and wing section have moderate slope "A" frame roofs and the front rests on a two string brick cornice. These houses rest on a rather high fieldstone foundation. Small enclosed chimneys rise from the side gables.
