DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two story, duplex pair of houses is detached on the west side and approximately five bays wide and four deep. A two story "T" shaped wing to the rear is four bays wide and two in depth. The roof of the front section is a slightly sloping flat, metal one and the wing has a slight slope metal "A" frame. There are three double hooded chimneys on the front section and one centered on the wing. All brickwork is unpainted common bond. Wide doorways occupy the front end bays and contain double paneled outer doors with round arched overlights and vestibules. The cornice separating the doors and overlights of each house is trimmed with rows of incised verticals, small dentils, and half rounds with superimposed roundels. Brick porches with iron railings and colonial lamps enhance the doorways. The brick pavement is in a herringbone design.

Two large round arched 1/1 sash windows occupy the inner first floor front bays. Two similar, but smaller, windows are located above them. Three sided 1/1 sash bay windows with panels, boxed cornices, and brackets hang over the doorways. All arches over the front windows and doors are of three rows of headers. Rear windows of the front section have 2/2 sash and those on the wing have 6/6 sash, all with two row header arches. All rear doors are paneled. A large gallery runs across the rear of both houses and forms a roof for the brick patios beneath. The cornice along the front roofline is adorned with rows of moulding, small dentils and incised verticals. At the base of the brick frieze is a moulded wooden strip with roundels tying in the bases of the brackets. The fieldstone foundation rises to the pavement level with the two foot high cellar windows in the base of the front brick wall.
