DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#42 and 44 E. Third Street are "L" shaped, three story in front, 2-1/2 in back, double semi-detached, and related buildings which face north on the southwest corner of E. Third and Middle Alley. The structure is a private, double-ownership residence of common bond with gambrel roof which is non-related to adjoining structures.

The principal facade of 44 E. Third is three bays in width. The main entrance door occupies the third bay from the southeast corner and consists of an entablature with brackets and pilasters. The four paneled single-leaf door has a semi-circular wooden arch over it. The first floor window beside the entrance is segmentally arched and consists of three parts, each with 1/1 sashes divided by fluted mullions and topped by a brick label. The second floor level is three bays wide and semi-circular transom windows and wooden window sills. The southwest bay is a double-round arched window separated by a fluted mullion and with two 2/1 sashes under transoms. The remaining bay is a single-round arched window with 2/1 sash beneath transom. Above the second floor level is a decorated boxed cornice with decorated frieze and brackets on either side of the building. Above the cornice on the third level are two dormer windows of 8/1 sash topped by a pediment. At the roofline is a plain boxed cornice with a single-stacked chimney on either side and a center chimney shared by both residences. The building sets on a stone foundation with a small basement window under the first level windows. There are three brick steps and a wooden stoop and wrought iron railing to the front entrance.

On the front wing side of 44 E. Third St., which faces Middle Alley, is one window between the first and second level with a 2/2 sash, plain lintel and a small basement window. Attached to the brick side (front wing) is a wooden first floor addition with one window. Also facing Middle Alley on the back wing of the house is an open balcony on the second level, four bays wide. There are three rectangular windows with 2/2 sashes, plain lintels, shutters, and one door on the second level. Under the balcony, beginning at the south corner, are three identical windows on the first level with the fourth bay replaced by the new wooden addition. In the back of the building there is a shared chimney; two small attic-recessed windows with plain lintel; two windows on second level (6/6 sash and lintel on west side of building and 1/1 sash and lintel on east side); a two paned and two paneled kitchen door on the west side; and a 1/1 sash window with plain lintel and shutters on the first level of the east side. There are two basement entrances side by side where the residences join.

The principal facade of 42 E. Third Street is similar to the adjoining residence. It is three bays in width; the main entrance door occupies the southeast bay and consists of a plain entablature. The four-paneled single leaf door has a half-round window above it. The first level window is segmentally arched, of two parts, consisting of 1/1 sashes and divided by a fluted mullion, topped by a brick label. The second floor level is two bays in width with two semi-circular windows with 9/1 sashes. The cornice motif is a repeat of 44 E. Third and above the cornice are two dormer windows with 8/1 sashes and topped by pediments. A plain box cornice follows the line of the roof. The two residences are identical in other respects.
