**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is an old pair of 2-1/2 story attached brick houses in a row and is five bays wide and approximately three in depth with #339 being three bays wide. Because of the grade, the rear of the building is 3-1/2 stories in height and it contains rear galleries and no wings. Rear yards are reached by descending steps under the front porch of #339 down 8' into an enclosed passage to the rear level. All brickwork is in common bond. Front entranceways occupy the second and third bays from the left (S) side. #339 retains an old four panel door, #341 has a newer door and both have low stoops and four pane overlights. #339 retains old 6/6 sash windows on the front and rear with louvered shutters on the front and old two panel shutters on the rear while #341 now has 1/1 sash with front louvered shutters. Both have wood sills and top moulded lintels on the front with regular wood lintels and sills on the rear. #339 retains old four panel doors on the rear with either tall paneled or board and batten shutters. Each attic is lighted by a small peaked 6/6 sash dormer window on the front. The building has a moderate slope "A" frame metal roof resting on three string brick cornices with a wide chimney rising from each gable. The eight ft. high fieldstone foundation rises to the front pavement level. The steps descending under the porch are guarded by an old cast iron railing. The front doorway of #339 originally occupied the center bay according to brickwork evidence.
