## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a row of four brick homes detached on the left alley side with #103, 105, & 107 being two stories and #101 three stories appearing to be a separate building. This building is eight bays wide and two bays in depth except for #101 which is three bays in depth. They each have two story brick "L" shaped wings 1-1/2 bays wide and five bays long with rear balconies except #101 which has a two story brick wing four bays deep and a full-width frame third story extension, rear frame extensions, and all have rear balconies. All brickwork is of common bond. Front entranceways occupy the left bay of each house with wide segmental arched moulded wood surrounds topped by moulded and peaked wooden "keystones" and each has a white marble sill and high transoms. #101 has a building width covered porch with Doric pillars and #103 appears to have had the inner four panel (round arched at the top) door moved to the front and restored to a natural finish.

To the right of these doorways are double 1/1 sash windows with moulded mullions and flat brick arches. These have decorative lugsills and #103 and #107 are protected by wrought iron box grills. Upper story windows are also of 1/1 sash but with segmental brick arches. All rear windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. The front sections of the building have roofs sloping to the rear and the wings have slight shed roofs of metal. The roof cornices of both #101 and the rest of the row are of the same Victorian incised design with the bays accented by moulded brackets and with incised wood panels in between. This building is set on a high foundation with four step porches.
