**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

#111 is a tall, three story detached brick house, three bays wide and approximately three bays in depth with a three story brick "L" shaped wing, two bays deep and 1-1/2 bays wide and a two story brick wing to the rear, three bays wide and three bays in depth with rear galleries. The tall front entranceway occupies the left bay with a newer paneled door, paneled enframing and soffit, three pane overlight and enclosed by a classic framing of paneled Doric pilasters supporting a high flat entablature. This is approached by a four step concrete stoop with sidewalls similar to #109. All front windows are of 6/6 sash with flat brick arches of long shaped voussoirs and with louvered shutters. Rear and side windows are of 6/6 and 2/2 sash with wood lintels and sills. The front section roof slopes to the rear and the wings have metal shed roofs. The front roof cornice line is rather simple, but heavy with mouldings and large dentils with the frieze ended by a band of cyma curved dentils. An unusual feature is that there are no brackets. The cornice continues around the corners. The building rests on a high foundation.
