DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a row of four, two story Victorian brick houses detached on the left side. It is eight bays wide and approximately five bays in depth with two, three story brick "T" shaped wings, four short bays wide and two bays in depth, angled to the front section and with second story rear balconies. All brickwork is of common bond. Front entranceways occupy the left bay of each house with all but #113 retaining the original double doors of six panels each, and all have round arched transoms with dentil trimmed transom bars and white marble sills. All except #117 retain the original five step, elaborately moulded cast iron porches. To the right of each entrance is a two story brick bay window section with segmental, two row header brick arched windows except #113 and #117 which have round arched windows with trefoil patterned heads on the front sections. Beneath the first floor windows are large segmental arched cellar windows with steps leading to the cellars, under the porches. Topping the bay window sections are moulded dentil trimmed cornices with ornate cast iron roof crestings with star designs, extending fence-like above and around the bay windows. Above the doorways are round arched windows, all of 1/1 sash. Rear area windows are of 6/6 sash with segmental, two row header brick arches on the first and third stories and wood lintels and sill on the second stories. There are glass over panel doors with two pane overlights. The design of the flat roofs is most unusual for Frederick as the wing and front sections all apparently slope toward the front with rainspouts (gutters) above the cornice. These roof cornices are also unusual, being attached horizontal tubes "held" by narrow, closely spaced, half round brackets. The frieze is trimmed by bands of moulded dentils and alternately long and short cylinders. This building sets on a high foundation with cellars mostly above ground level. All except #117 retain their herringbone brick patterned pavements. There are long yards to the rear.
