DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Nos. 110, 112, 114 & 116 E. Third Street occupy a double "U" shaped building with the straight edge fronting on the south side of E. Third Street facing north. It is a residential, multiple-ownership building which is attached and related to 118 E. Third St. and attached and non-related to 108 E. Third Street. It is two stories, flat roofed at the front section with low gabled roofs over the three projecting sections at the rear.

The principal facade is eight bays in width (each individual residence occupying two bays). Main entrance doors occupy the first, fourth, fifth, and eighth bays at the first level. The remaining bays are occupied by large semi-circular windows. Semi-circular surrounds also frame the doors. Each bay at the second level is occupied by a smaller semi-circular window. The roof cornice at the eaves level is scroll bracketed with a decorated frieze and a dropped architrave. Common bond brick runs several feet below the entablature while the rest of the facade is running bond. The windows are topped with a double row of radiating headers. A wooden, shed-roofed portico runs the entire length of the facade at the first level. It is supported by five wooden Doric columns. A pierced chimney is located on the side slope of the center gabled roof at the back.

The only other exposed side is the back of the building (the south end). Each of the three jutting sections contains four bays, a window and door in each quarter section. A simple railed porch extends above the first level giving access to their porches, but now, however, to the ground level. Simple flat concrete porches are at the ground level. The inner walls of the "U" sections contain numerous simple, two sash windows.
