**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a 2-1/2 story detached brick pair of houses, four bays wide and approximately three bays in depth with a two story "T" shaped wing approximately three bays square with side balconies. All brickwork is in common bond. Simple entranceways occupy the outer bays with old four paneled (top panels round arched) doors, marble sills and segmental arched transoms. All front windows are now of 1/1 sash with segmental brick arches with the first floor windows protected by wrought iron box grills. Side and rear windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills and the attics are well lighted by two six pane windows in each gable. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof resting on three string brick cornices on the front and rear and with double flue enclosed chimneys rising on each end. The wing has a low slope "A" frame roof with a wide chimney on the end, and all roofing is of metal. This building sets on a low fieldstone foundation. To the rear are lawn areas with boxwood and evergreens.
