DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick detached pair of houses four bays wide and three bays in depth with a two story brick "T" shaped wing, two bays in depth and approximately three bays wide with side balconies. All brickwork is in common bond. Rather simple front entranceways occupy the outer bays with #212 retaining the old four paneled (top panels round arched) door now refinished in natural tone, and #210 has a newer paneled door, but the original three pane overhead. Both have paneled enframements. On the front facade of #212 is an old cast iron cellar window grill with a projecting male cherub face common in other older Frederick homes. #210 retains the original, hand-blown, 6/6 sash windows on the front with #212 windows being of 2/2 sash and both have flat brick arches of shaped voussoirs and louvered shutters. Rear area windows are of hand-blown 6/6 sash on #210, but 1/1 sash on #212, both with flat brick arches. There is an original four panel door with a three pane overhead on the rear of #210. The attics are lighted by two small 6/6 sash windows in the right gable and one in the left gable. The front section has a steep slope "A" frame roof with slate covering #210, and asphalt shingles are on #212 and resting on a three string brick cornice on the front. There are double flue enclosed chimneys rising from each gable. The wing has a low slope "A" frame metal roof. The building sets on a rather high fieldstone foundation. #210 is fronted by a herringbone patterned brick pavement. To the rear of #210 is a brick patio and flower beds.
