DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a trio of 2-1/2 story brick houses detached on the right side and the building is seven bays wide and two bays in depth. #223 has a newer "L" shaped two story brick wing, 1-1/2 bays wide and two bays in depth, while #225 & 227 share an off-centered "T" shaped 1-1/2 story brick original wing. This is three bays wide and two bays in depth having the appearance of an "L" shape on #225, which has a three bay wide front section. All brickwork is of common bond, but #227 has been covered with aluminum siding. Simple front entranceways occupy the right (East) bay of #223 and 225, and the left bay of #227. There is an enclosed passageway to the rear yards in the left bay of #225. Front doors are of newer styles, but all have paneled enframements and three pane overlights. They are approached by high brick and block porches of seven steps. Doors to cellar entrances beneath the porches and for the rear passageway are of board and batten construction. All front windows are now of 1/1 sash with wood lintels and sills and with 2/2 sash on the rear of the front section. All front windows except on #227 have top moulded lintels with raised moulded end blocks and louvered shutters. The wing of #223 has small 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills with a sliding, single pane sash casement window in the rear. #225 and 227 have two pairs of "lie on your stomach" four pane casement windows on each side of the wing, but first floor windows are newer. The attics of #223 and 225 are lighted by small 1/1 sash peaked dormer windows on the rear and #227 has two small four pane windows in the right gable. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof resting on two string brick cornices, front and rear and small enclosed chimneys rise from each end and the center of the roofline. The wing of #223 has a shed roof and the others share a low "A" frame, and all are of metal. These houses rest on a high fieldstone foundation with the cellars mostly above ground level.
