DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a row of six brick, 2-1/2 story houses detached on the right (West) side. The building is fifteen bays wide and two bays in depth with #228, 234, and 238 being three bays wide and the others being two bays wide. The wings vary considerably and will be written separately--#228 has a two story, brick "L" shaped wing, approximately two bays square with a side balcony, shed roof, and 6/6 sash windows with thin wood lintels and sills. #230 and 232 share a 1-1/2 story brick "T" shaped wing, three bays wide and two bays in depth with a low slope, metal "A" frame roof resting on two string brick cornices and with 6/6 sash on the first floor and two pairs of "lie on your stomach" low, four pane casement windows above. #234 has a two story (formerly 1-1/2 stories) brick, "L" shaped wing, 1-1/2 bays wide and two bays in depth with an asphalt shingled, low slope shed roof and 6/6 and newer sash windows. #236 has a 1-1/2 story brick "L" shaped wing, 1-1/2 bays wide and two bays in depth with a metal shed roof and two pairs of four pane "lie on your stomach" windows. #238 has a 1-1/2 story brick "L" wing, two bays wide and two longer bays in depth with a metal shed roof resting on a two string brick cornice and low "lie on your stomach" single pane casement windows. Simple front entranceways occupy the right bays of #230 and 236; the center bays of 228, 234 & 238; and in the left (East) bay of #232. They have a variety of newer doors. Enclosed passageways to the rear yards are in the left bays of #228 and 240 with #234 and 238 being in the right bays. Front windows of #232, 234, and 236 are still 6/6 sash with #228 having 6/1 sash and the others--1/1 sash windows. All front windows have louvered shutters, and all have moulded top lintels with raised moulded end block-brackets, except for #228 which has plain lintels and sills. The attic of each house is lighted by a 6/6 sash peaked dormer window on the front roofline. This roof section is of a moderate slope "A" frame construction (metal) resting on two string brick cornices on the front and rear with small chimneys rising on the right or left of each house. The building sets on a low fieldstone foundation. All brickwork is of common bond.
