**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a row of four brick 2-1/2 story houses attached on each side. The building is ten bays wide and approximately two bays in depth with #240 and 246 being three bays wide. The wings vary considerably with #240 having a two story brick "L" shaped, 1-1/2 bay wide and three bay in depth with a side balcony, metal shed roof and 6/6 sash windows with wood lintels and sills. #242 has a two story, apparently newer, wing being two short bays wide and four bays in depth covered with new metal siding, has a rather flat roof and new windows. #244 has a two story brick, two bay square wing with a small side balcony, a shed roof, and small 6/6 sash windows with wood lintels and sills. #246 has a rear balcony and no wing but a small, one story frame extension also 6/6 sash windows with wood lintels and sills. All brickwork is of common bond. Simple front entrances occupy the center bays of #240 and 246 with 242 in the left (East) bay and 244 in the right bay. These have newer doors with one, two, or three pane overlights. #244 has a covered, full-width front porch with the roof supported by turned pillars and plain square ballusters. Front windows of #240 and 242 are of 1/1 sash with lintels moulded at the top and with raised moulded end blocks, also above the doors. #244 and 246 have 6/1 sash except for 1/1 sash on the first floor of #242, and both have louvered shutters. The lintels of #244 are similar to 240 and 242, but those on #246 have simple top moulding. The attics of all except #246 are lighted by 6/6 peaked dormer windows on the front roof. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof resting on a two string brick cornice, and all are of metal except for slate on #246. Small chimneys rise from the roofline for each house. The building sets on a rather low foundation.
