**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

#6 is a two story, brick, detached Victorian townhouse, three bays wide and four bays in depth with a two story brick "L" shaped wing composed of a one bay deep section two bays wide and a three bay long extension. There are side balconies and enclosed rear balconies. All brickwork is in common bond with the front facade with a light red brick and a shallow tower section projects on the front of the right (W) half of the house dividing it optically into two sections. The front entranceway occupies the left bay with double doors of glass and a segmentally arched transom. To the right of this is a segmentally arched window and in the right bay at the base of the tower section is a double window, and both have segmentally arched transoms of amber-stained glass. Above the doorway and smaller window is a three sided bay window decorated with dentils, fluted pilasters, and panels. To the right of this are two round arched windows, and all are of 1/1 sash. Most windows are headed by three row brick header arches. The "tower section" is topped by a hipped roof of slate decorated by an ornamental ballustrade with a finial decorated by scrolled arms on one end. At the base of this is a band of dentil trim continuing around the tower, and below this is a brick frieze laid in a basketweave pattern. Above the left half of the front facade is a low shingled mansard section centered by a pediment bearing a sunburst design and trimmed by dentils at the base. Side and rear area windows are of 2/2 sash with those on the first floor being taller and with louvered shutters and two row header brick arches. The front roof slopes to the rear and the wing has a shed roof. The house sets on a low fieldstone foundation. It is fronted by a herringbone patterned brick pavement.
