DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#9 is a two story brick detached house, three bays wide and two bays in depth with a wing and several extensions. The first section is one bay deep and full width, being slightly lower, and the second section is a low, three story structure, the same height as the front section and is an "L" shaped, two bays wide and three bays deep. Added to this is a two story brick extension two bays wide and one bay deep with a rear balcony. All brickwork is in common bond and there are star brace terminals in the sidewall of the three story extension. The front entranceway occupies the left (W) bay with a newer door and granite sill, all framed by a broad moulded architrave, elliptically arched and with a high transom. A bay window projects above this with 1/1 sash windows as on the first floor front and the other second story front windows are of 2/2 sash, all with flat brick arches of shaped voussoirs. First floor windows are taller and protected by old cast iron box grills. The doorway is approached by a brick porch with a side entrance and wrought iron railing. Rear area windows become shorter as they rise and are mostly 2/2 sash with two row header, segmental arches and louvered shutters. There is a wide first floor wing side bay window with dentil trim. The front section roof slopes to the rear with stepped sidewalls, and the wing has a shed roof. The front roofline has an overhanging cornice with closely spaced cyma curved modillions, and the frieze is ended by a moulded band. The house rests on a rather low fieldstone foundation. It is fronted by a herringbone patterned brick pavement. To the rear is a very attractive dooryard patio with a small pool and edged by flower beds, all enclosed by walls.
