DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a two story detached brick pair of houses, four bays wide and two bays in depth with an off-centered "T" shaped, two story brick wing, four bays deep, being full width for #14 and 1-1/2 bays wide for #16. There is a rear balcony on #14 and side balcony for #16, which also has a newer brick and frame rear extension. Front entranceways occupy the first and third bays from the right (W) and like the rest of the front facade, both sections are of differing designs. #14 has a simple, round arched doorway and transom but with a very ornately-carved Victorian door. To the left of this is a triple, elliptically arched, 1/1 sash window with mullions bearing attached fluted pillars with top sections moulded and tapered. Above these regular sash are transom sections of small panes of colored glass. #16 has a rectangular entranceway with a newer paneled door and narrow overhead headed by a grooved lintel with end blocks carved with roundels as over the second floor windows. Both entrances have white marble sills and three step brick or wood porches with wrought iron side railings. The front first floor window of #16 is a bow-shaped enclosure of small panes. Second story front windows of #14 are round arched with 1/1 sash and #16 has 6/6 sash. The wing has 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills for both sides with an additional 6/6 JIB window door on the wing of #16. The front section roof slopes to the rear and the wing has a rather flat roof. The roofline is fronted by a rather simple overhanging Victorian cornice with a wooden frieze and closely spaced, cyma curved brackets with turned pendants. This building sets on a low fieldstone foundation and is fronted by a herringbone patterned pavement. To the rear of #14 is a small arbor covered stone patio.
