DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a row of three 2-1/2 story brick houses detached on the right (E) side. #15 and #17 are two bays wide and #19 is three bays wide, all two bays in depth. #15 & #17 share a two story brick "T" shaped wing three bays wide and five bays in depth with side balconies and a one bay square brick dependency. #19 has a two story brick "L" shaped wing, one bay wide and five bays long with a side balcony and one story, brick dependency. Outer walls are 14" thick and cellar joists are joined by wooden pegs, and apparently, hand hewn. The front facade has been recently restored, revealing a soft salmon, hand-made brick, and all is in common bond. Front entranceways occupy the first, fifth, and sixth bays from the left and an enclosed passageway to the rear yards occupies the third bay from the left with a board and batten gate and stickwork grill above. All have newer doors and round arched transoms with three row header arches as over the first floor windows, except for #19 which has had the top row altered to a drip moulding. #19 originally had narrow double doors, but they have been replaced by a more narrow single door and the spaces filled in by framing and grooved pilasters. #15 & #17 retain the old ornamental cast iron porches and #19 now has a low brick porch. All second story front windows are now of 1/1 sash with flat brick arches of shaped voussoirs and have louvered shutters. All wings have 6/6 sash windows with wood lintels and sills, louvered shutters, and #19 has a 6/9 sash on each story. There are four panel kitchen doors. The front sections have moderate slope "A" frame roofs resting on two string brick cornices. The attics are lighted by 6/6 sash peaked dormer windows on the rear of #17 and #19, and two small four pane windows in the right gable of #15. A double flue chimney rises from the gable of #15 and a wide chimney serves both #17 and #19. The wing has a shed roof on #19 and the "T" wing is rather flat, and both are of metal. The building sets on a low fieldstone foundation. The houses are fronted by herringbone patterned brick sidewalks. All have rear lawn areas and flower gardens with a rear patio on #15.
