DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#20 is now a 2-1/2 story brick house, four bays wide and two bays in depth with a 2-1/2 story brick "L" shaped wing three bays in depth and two bays wide with an enclosed side balcony and several newer brick and frame extensions. It is detached on the right (W) alley side. The brickwork of the front and right side has been recently restored revealing a dark red brick in Flemish bond through the first floor level and common bond in a soft salmon color above on the front which indicates that this was originally a 1-1/2 story house. The main entranceway occupies the second bay from the right with a newer Colonial design door, paneled enframing and surrounded by Doric pilasters and a flat entablature above. Projecting above this and the adjoining window is a wide bay window centered by double windows with 6/1 and 4/1 sash with fluted mullions. First floor windows are of 2/2 sash and those on the second story are 6/6 sash, all with louvered shutters, wood sills and top moulded lintels. Side and original rear windows are also of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills and louvered shutters. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof resting on three string brick cornices, front and rear. Double flue enclosed chimneys rise from each gable. The wing has a steep slope "A" frame roof resting on two string brick cornices and with a double flue chimney centered on the ridge, and both are of metal. The attic is lighted by two small four pane sash from the right gable. The house rests on a low fieldstone foundation.
