DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#101 is a three story brick detached house, four bays wide and two bays in depth with a two story brick "L" shaped wing, two bays in width and three bays long, side balconies, and a two story brick extension. Sidewall evidence shows this to have been built as a 2-1/2 story brick house with a two story, two bay square wing. All brickwork is in common bond. The front entranceway occupies the left (W) bay with a newer door, paneled enframingent, and a narrow transom. This is fronted by a concrete porch extending across one half of the front with New Orleans style iron grillwork supporting a wide second story bay window. First and second story windows are of 1/1 sash with 2/2 sash on the third story, and they become smaller as they rise. These windows are topped by moulded lintels and trimmed by dentils which also adorn the door transom bar and bay window cornice. Rear area windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills and louvered shutters. There is an old four panel door with a three pane overlight. The front roof slopes to the rear and the wing has a shed roof. The front roofline has a moulded Victorian cornice trimmed with bands of lozenges and small spheres with moulded brackets accenting the bays. This house sets on a low fieldstone foundation and there is a herringbone patterned brick pavement. There are rear gardens with flagstone walkways, lawn areas, evergreens, flowering trees, and seasonal flowers.
