DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick pair of houses detached on the right (N) side, six bays wide and two bays in depth with a 2-1/2 story brick "T" shaped wing four bays deep and approximately three bays wide with enclosed side balconies. Newer rear extensions have been added to #411. All brickwork is in common bond. Front entranceways occupy the center bays of each house with four panel doors with top panels rounded, paneled enframements, and overlights. Front windows are of 1/1 sash except for the second story of #409 which retains 6/6 sash and all have wood sills and moulded top lintels as above the doors. Enclosed passageways to the rear yards are guarded by board and batten gates headed by stick grillwork on #409 and Victorian cut grillwork on #411 and occupy the end bays. Rear windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills and there are old four panel doors with four pane overlights. The attic of #409 is lighted by a small four pane window in the right gable and the wing attic has a 6/6 sash window for each house. Both house sections have moderate slope "A" frame roofs of metal with the front section resting on three string brick cornices. A large square chimney rises from the center of the ridgeline. This pair of houses rests on a low fieldstone foundation. #411 retains a herringbone brick pavement. Flower gardens lie to the rear of the houses.
