DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#107 is a three story brick house, detached on the right (E) side and is approximately three bays square with a two story brick "L" shaped wing, two bays wide and five bays long with a side balcony and a two story brick, one bay square dependency extension. All brickwork is in common bond and the front has been restored. The main entranceway occupies the left bay with double doors of panels with tops round arched, a white marble sill, and a round arched transom. This is framed by paneled Doric pilasters which support a protruding Victorian moulded cornice trimmed by a band of heart-shaped motifs and with a carved wooden "keystone" over the doorway and cyma curved fluted brackets on either side. This is entered by a two step granite stoop with sidewalls bearing carved panels, and this leads to a vestibule with double inner doors having top rounded panes. To the right are tall windows with short top sashes and wrought iron box grills. Upper story windows are of regular size, all have 1/1 sash and flat brick arches of shaped voussoirs. On the first floor rear of the front section is a 1/1 JIB window-door. Wing windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. The dependency has a board and batten door. The roof of the front section slopes to the rear with stepped sidewalls, and the wing has a shed roof. The front roofline is decorated by a heavy, overhanging cornice with large modillions and a wooden frieze with panels. Large, richly moulded brackets adorned with floral crockets divide the bays. This building sets on a moderately high foundation. There is a rear wingside patio of brick.

This appears to be a Federal/Victorian transition structure as there is no discernable sidewall evidence of it having formerly been a Federal, 2-1/2 story house. Its trim is of modest proportions, and it blends well with both styles found on this street.
