DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a three story pair of attached Victorian brick houses, four bays wide and three bays in depth with two, two story brick "L" shaped wings, two bays deep and 1-1/2 bays wide with side balconies and a one bay square, two story brick extension. All brickwork is in common bond and the front is faced with an off-white pressed brick. The front facade is termed Flemish Medieval style by the Brinkman Survey with the third story being rather ornate in design. Front entranceways occupy the second and fourth bays from the left (W) with newer doors and granite sills, #109 with a round arched transom and #111 being flat arched, and both having transom bars decorated by a scalloped design. These are approached by high porches of five steps, #109 with a wrought iron railing, and #111 with turned wooden ballusters. To the left bay of each house is a two story brick bay window section with double windows, flat arched on the first floor and round arched on the second as are the smaller windows over the doorways. These bays are shaped differently on the corners with #109 having three sided indentations corbelled at the top and bottom and #111 having rounded corners. All building windows are of 1/1 sash with two row jack arches of headers and stretchers on the front and wood lintels and sills on the rear with louvered shutters. The third story is fronted by a slate mansard roof section, framed by metal mouldings with differing patterns of slate-work and differently shaped, protruding pediment sections. #109 has a wide, steep brick pediment with three evenly-spaced small round arched windows and is topped by a decorative acroteria. The third story of #111 is fronted by a triple round arched window, off center, with a smaller side window and is topped by a very steep pediment or gable richly decorated by an embossed metal tympanium with floral designs and scrolled foliage. This is also topped by an ornate acroteria. The front section roof slopes to the rear from the mansard and the wings have shed roofs. This building sets on a high foundation faced with rock-textured brickwork. The front pavement is laid in a herringbone brick design.
