DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a three story brick attached pair of houses, four bays wide and two bays in depth with "U" shaped brick, two story wings, two bays in depth and 1-1/2 bays wide with end balconies. All brickwork is in common bond. Front entranceways occupy the end bays with double doors of glass with rectangular transoms divided by narrow end sections. These have segmental brick arches of three rows of headers with the infills centered by roundels and with panels, as do all front windows. The center third of each house of the front facade rises before a mansard to accommodate double windows similar to those below, and these are pedimented. This mansard section is covered by slate with a moulded trim band, and the roof slopes to the rear. The doorways are approached by three step brick porches with iron railings. All house windows are of 1/1 sash with segmental brick arches. The wing has a metal shed roof. The front facade is headed by a boxed cornice beneath the mansard section. This building sets on a rather high foundation. #110 is fronted by a herringbone patterned brick pavement. To the rear are long narrow lawn and flower bed areas.
