DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#130 is a very tall, three story brick home detached on the left (E) side. It is three bays wide and approximately four bays in depth with a two story brick "L" shaped wing, six bays in depth and two bays wide with a long side balcony and a one bay square dependency formerly used as a smokehouse and toilet. All brickwork is laid in comon bond and the front facade is faced with a dark red pressed brick. This is dominated by a large classic entranceway in the right bay with double doors of long, classic, round-ended panels, an enframe-ment of round ended panels, brownstone sill, a transom bar carved with a band of spheres and a four pane overlight. The whole is framed by pil-asters topped by a segmentally arched hooded cornice supported by fluted and scrolled brackets with foliated endings. This is approached by a porch of five steps with wrought iron railings and leads to a large vestibule and inner door with round arched panes over panels, side lights and overlights. The first floor has two 6/9 sash, tall windows headed by segmental hooded arched cornices with small brackets and bracketed lugsills. Upper story windows are of 6/6 sash with moulded cornices having arced ends with turned pendant drops. All rear area windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills, and there are newer doors. The roof of the front section slopes to the rear and the wing has a shed roof, both of metal. An overhanging boxed cornice trimmed with moulded dentils and supported by paired, scrolled brackets trimmed by spheres, decorates the front roofline and side corners. This house rests on a low, wide fieldstone foundation with the top section cellar walls of brick. There is a wide sideyard laid in a herringbone brick pattern.
