#139 West Third Street is a three story common bond brick townhouse, four bays wide. The main entrance, a replaced door with four light transom and recessed paneling is located in the first bay. A passageway leading to the rear of the building is located in the fourth bay. Occupying the remaining bays on the first and second level are double hung 6/6 windows covered by storm windows. Located over each bay is a pedimented wood lintel similar to

Believed to be a pre-Civil War structure, circa 1859. This building is the last on the street in the historical district. It ends in the rhythm of the streetscape in this area as a final statement of these similar later 19th century structures.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a long, 2-1/2 story row of Federal shaped houses (originally) with Greek Revival trim. Three retain the original front facades, but two houses have been raised to three stories and altered considerably. #131 and 133 are three bays wide with #135 to 137 being two bays wide and #139 four bays wide. All are two bays deep with #131 and 133 and #135 & 137 sharing "T" shaped wings of two stories, three bays deep and two bays wide. #139 is backed by an "L" shaped wing of the same size. #135 and 137 also share a 1-1/2 story, one bay deep, two bay wide extension, and #139 has the remains of the same size extension with the top section raised to a frame second story. #131 and 133 have been raised to three stories with #131 having a small, one story, rear extension and #133 having a long new extension of block and frame construction. Front entranceways occupy the first, sixth, seventh, eleventh and twelfth bays from the left (W) side which is a street corner. #131 and 137 apparently have original four paneled doors with the others being newer. All have paneled enframements, and all except #133 and 137 retain four pane overlights. The fourth and ninth bays from the left contain enclosed passageways to the rear yards and are fronted by board and batten gates and Victorian stickwork grills at the top with a pedimented cornice with ears. First floor windows also vary considerably with #131, 133 & 135 having round arched, double 1/1 sash windows with grooved mullions topped by a roundel; #137 with a segmental arched double 1/1 sash window with the same trim, and #139 has two regular 1/1 sash windows. All second story front windows, except #133, are of 6/6 sash with pedimented wooden cornices with ears  as over all the front door and first floor windows of #139. All houses are laid in common bond and are crossed by a three string belt course with protruding top and bottom rows at the base of the top story window levels. #135, 137 and 139 retain the original 2-1/2 story height with the 1/2 stories lighted by small eight pane casement "lie on your stomach" sashes on the front and rear. #131 has three low 6/6 sash windows on the third story and #133 is now fronted by a two story bay window section in the center bay. The remaining original wings have small 6/6 sash windows with wood lintels and sills and some with louvered shutters. The extensions of #135 & 137 have small, four pane end gable windows. The front sections of #135, 137 & 139 have moderate slope "A" frame roofs with a wide chimney on the ridge between 137 & 139. The old rear extensions have moderate slope "A" frame roofs also, and all being of metal. The front roof cornices also vary with #131 having a brick frieze and dentils, #133 having a Victorian wood cornice with dentils and pierced patera; and #135, 137, & 139 having a four string brick frieze with brick dentils. All are set on a low foundation and the pavement is laid in a brick herringbone pattern for #133, 137, and 139.
