DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is now a wide, three story brick pair of houses, detached on the right (W) street cornerside. It is six bays wide and two bays in depth with a one bay wide, two story brick recessed right side extension. This is joined on the right rear corner by an older 2-1/2 story house approximately three bays square with side and rear balconies with balusters of a Victorian cut-out design. The left bay of the front section is extended by a brick, 2-1/2 story, "L" shaped, six bay long wing with a side balcony and a small brick dependency extension. The front facade has been recently restored revealing a very light red shade of brick, and all laid in common bond. Front entranceways occupy the center bays with multi-paneled doors and are headed by round arched transoms with transom bars ornamented by a band of finely cut squares carved with very small roundels. Topping those are three row header brick hood moulds centered by brick "keystones" of shaped voussoirs. This transom and hood mould design is repeated above the first floor windows which are of 1/1 sash. The first floor is fronted completely by a low brick porch with wrought iron railings and a planting of yew. The front pavement is laid in a herringbone brick design and flowering trees also enhance this area. All second story front windows are of 6/6 sash with grooved lintels and end blocks carved with roundels. These lintels are set into the brick frieze which is headed by a boxed cornice with closely spaced fluted modillions above a broad, superimposed wooden frieze. The cornice is supported by cyma curved fluted brackets at either end. The third story is fronted by a mansard roof in a fish scale shingle design and backed by a metal sheathed mansard with the roof center being slightly peaked. This story is well lighted by five 2/2 sash pedimented dormer windows with the center one being double on the front roofline and two 2/2 sash pedimented dormer windows on the rear. Other rear and side windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills and some with louvered shutters. The wing attic is lighted by two 6/6 peaked dormers and the older house section on the right has small, four pane windows in the gables. Some wing doors have four pane overlights and the rear dependency has a board and batten door. The roof of the right house section has a steep slope "A" frame and the left wing has a shed roof, both of metal. This building sets on a low foundation.
