**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

#7 is a detached, two story brick house, three bays square with a two story brick "L" shaped wing, two bays wide and six short bays long with a side balcony. All brickwork is of common bond. The front entrance occupies the left (W) bay with double doors of panels, a white marble sill and a round arched transom. First floor front windows are also round arched, and those on the second story are segmentally arched, all with 1/1 sash and brick header arches. Side windows are mostly of 2/2 sash with segmental arches on the right side and topped by newer metal lintels on the left. The front section roof slopes to the rear and the wing has a shed roof. The front roofline has a Victorian "V" shaped cornice with bands of incised crosses, beading and scallops. The house rests on a low fieldstone foundation and is fronted by a herringbone patterned sidewalk.
