(use reverse side if necessary) BUILDING IS ORIGINAL AND BASICALLY UNALTERED BOTH EXTERNALLY AND INTERNALLY. IT BLENDS INTO AND CONTRIBUTES TO STREETSCAPE OF THE HISTORIC DISTRICT. AS A TYPICAL EXAMPLE OF HOMES BUILT DURING THAT PERIOD IT IS IN THE MIST OF AN ENTIRE BLOCK WHICH IS IN THE PROCESS OF RESTORATION. 152 4th Street IS ONE OF THE LARGER HOMES AND ONE OF THE FEW SINGLE HOMES ALONG E. 4th STREET. RESTORED IT WILL ADD GREATLY TO THE HISTORIC DISTRICT RENOVATION PROCESS SPREADING ALONG N. MARKET ST. ALONG WITH 2nd ST. AND 5th ST.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#25 is a 2-1/2 story detached brick house, four bays wide and two bays deep with a two story, brick "L" shaped wing, two bays square with an enclosed side balcony and one story frame extension. All brickwork is in common bond. The front entranceway occupies the third bay from the left (W) side with a newer door and narrow overlight. The entire first floor is fronted by a covered porch with turned pillars. First floor windows are now of 1/1 sash and the second story has 2/2 sash, all with segmental brick arches with incised infills. Rear area windows are a combination of 6/2, 2/2 and 1/1 sash all with wood lintels and sills. The attic is lighted by a pair of small 4+4 casement windows in each gable. The front section has a steep slope "A" frame roof of metal resting on a three string brick cornice on the front and a two string cornice on the rear. Small enclosed chimneys rise from each end. The wing has a shed roof. This house rests on a rather high fieldstone foundation.







Window Trim






