**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a pair of 2-1/2 story attached brick houses, five bays wide and two bays in depth with two story brick "U" shaped wings three bays in depth and two bays wide with side balconies and #429 has a two story brick extension. All brickwork is in painted common bond. Front entranceways occupy the second and fifth bays from the left (S) side with an original four panel door on #431, paneled enframements, white marble sills, four pane overlights with dentiled transom bars, and headed by wood lintels with top trim of moulding and dentils as above all front windows. An enclosed passageway to rear yards occupies the center bay. Front windows are of 6/1 & 1/1 sash on #429 and 6/6 sash on #431. Rear area windows are of 2/2 and 6/6 on #429 and 6/6 on #431, all with wood lintels and sills. There are four panel kitchen doors. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof resting on three string brick cornices with the bottom row on the front in a dentil pattern. A wide enclosed chimney rises from the left side. The wing has a shed roof and both are of metal. The building rests on a low fieldstone foundation and is fronted by a herringbone patterned brick pavement. There is an unusual decorated bathroom with wall panels of moulding and corner designs in roses with a central moulded ceiling medallion, all in three dimensional frescoe work -- a work of expert craftsmanship.
