DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a detached corner brick shop and adjoining residence of two stories, approximately four bays square with a two story, brick "L" shaped wing, two bays square and a newer side extension of the same size making it now a rectangular building with part of the wing extending to the right (E). There is a balcony on the newer side extension. All brickwork is in common bond. The former grocery store occupies the front of #101 with a large paned door and shop windows on either side. This is framed by pilasters trimmed with lozenge shaped panels and headed by Victorian cornice decor with bands of scallops, dog-tooth chevrons and incised designs on the frieze. This is supported by concave, fluted brackets ended by larger moulded brackets. #103 now has a newer door and segmental arched transom. All front windows are of 1/1 sash with segmental brick arches. Side and rear windows have 2/2 sash with flat brick arches. The front section, metal roof slopes to the rear, and the wing area has a rather flat roof. The front Victorian cornice is decorated by small concave brackets, bands of mouldings and dentils. Larger channeled brackets divide and end the bays. This building rests on a low field-stone foundation.

The side alley facade contains the remains of an old painted sign, "Lewis M. Kintz, Groceries & Provisions" and another for chewing tobacco.
