DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is an attached pair of 2-1/2 story, large brick houses, six bays wide and approximately three bays in depth and of good proportions. They each have a two story, brick "L" shaped wing extending from the left side, two bays wide, five in depth and with long side balconies. All brickwork is in common bond. The front entrances occupy the left bay of each house with newer doors and high segmental arched transoms. All front windows are now of 1/1 sash with brick segmental arches as above the doors. Rear windows are of 6/6 sash with flat brick arches. The attic of each house is lighted by a peaked dormer window on the rear and that on #127 retains 6/6 sash. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof resting on three string brick cornices and a double flue enclosed chimney rises on the right side of each house. The wings have shed roofs and all are of metal. The houses rest on a brick-faced fieldstone foundation.
