DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a pair of attached brick 2-1/2 story houses, five bays wide and approximately three bays in depth with 1-1/2 story brick "U" shaped wings three bays deep and one bay wide. The wing of #507 has been built up in 1926 to a full two stories with a balcony and both houses have first floor frame extensions (summer kitchens). All brickwork is in common bond and #507 has been restored. Front entrances occupy the left (S) bay of each house with #505 retaining a four panel door, paneled enframement, four pane overlight, and a dentiled transom bar. This is approached by an ornate cast iron two step porch. #507 now has a round arched doorway with a newer door, and the first floor is shielded by a covered porch with turned pillars. An enclosed passageway to the rear yards occupies the center bay. The front windows of #505 retain 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills with the lintels decorated by moulded tops and dentil trim. #507 has a newer (1926) round arched window (removed from another house) on the first floor, and those on the second story have moulded topped lintels formerly with dentil trim, louvered shutters, and all are now of 1/1 sash. #505 has 6/6 sash on the first floor of the wing with 4+4 pane sliding casement "lie on your stomach" windows in the top section. All rear windows of #507 are of 6/6 sash and all have wood lintels and sills. The attic of #505 is lighted by a 6/6 sash peaked dormer window in the rear roof. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof resting on three string brick cornices with the front bottom row in a dentil design. Double flue enclosed chimneys rise from each gable. The wings have shed roofs and that of #505 rests on a two string brick cornice. All roofing is of metal. The houses rest on a low fieldstone foundation. #505 is fronted by a herringbone patterned brick pavement.
