DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a row of four, 2-1/2 story brick houses detached on the left (W) side, eight bays wide and approximately three in depth. Each pair of houses shares a brick "T" shaped wing of two stories, four narrow bays wide and two in depth with rear balconies. All brickwork is in common bond. Round arched front entrances are grouped in the inner bays of each pair of houses with newer doors, transoms, dentiled transom bars and vestibules. These are approached by pairs of ornate cast iron porches. The front windows of the end bay of each house is wider than those above the doors and most house windows are of 1/1 sash. The front windows have flat-headed brick segmental arches while those on the side and rear have regular, two row header brick segmental arches except for wood lintels and sills on the first floor of the rear. The attic of each house is lighted from the rear by a 6/6 peaked dormer window. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof resting on three string brick cornices. Double flue enclosed chimneys rise at the center and each end of the building. The wings have low, "A" frame roofs and all are of metal. The building rests on a low fieldstone foundation.
