
The William H. Kamp Farm is located at 1391 Chestnut Ridge Road on a slightly sloping hillside. The side gable frame house is four bays by three bays. Each one over one, double-hung window is a vinyl replacement window. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles. The house is clad with asbestos shingles and the enclosed porch, which wraps around the south and west facades, is clad in vinyl siding. According to William Kamp, who has lived in the home since his birth 75 years ago, the porch was enclosed in 1999. The siding has been replaced with asbestos shingles and the windows are one-over-one, wood sash windows, except the windows in the enclosed porch, which are aluminum. There is one central chimney that pierces the ridgeline.

This house has been significantly altered by replacement window and siding and the enclosure of the porch. Additionally, this house is a common vernacular style and lacks architectural distinction. This property does not appear to be eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.



DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The William H. Kamp Farm consists of a house, a bank barn, and one outbuilding.

The house is a frame, two story, gable-roofed building on a whitewashed, coursed, rubble stone foundation. Its basic configuration is a 5 bay by 3 bay rectangular plan with a full facade porch. The facade bay an offset entrance, slightly north of center. The facade porch wraps around the south elevation and is partially enclosed.

The house has been covered with asbestos shingles, and the roof with asphalt shingles. Windows are one over one sash with drip molded window heads.

According to the owner, William Kamp, the floor joists are hewn.

The outbuilding and the frame bank barn lie south of the house.


